Lesson Plan: Iconic Stories from 150 Years of Sport in Manitoba



Sport Manitoba partnered with local author Sean Grassie to write and publish *Iconic Stories from 150 Years of Sport in Manitoba*. It includes 150 stories of iconic moments of sport in Manitoba, and there are numerous examples to educate students about Manitoba's sport history.

This activity is available in both English and French and is based on *A special collection of 6 Olympic medals*, that tells the story of Cindy Klassen and her journey to a record-breaking performance at the 2006 Torino Olympics. Students will have the opportunity to learn about the importance of being a multi-sport athlete, increase their knowledge about Manitoba sport history, and learn about one of Canada's most decorated female Olympians.
